On **5th June 2022**, Sri Arvind Mahila College, Patna, celebrated **World Environment Day** with a combination of educational and action-oriented activities organized by the **National Service Scheme (NSS)** in collaboration with the **Department of Political Science**. The event was aimed at raising awareness about environmental issues, promoting sustainable practices, and encouraging students to take an active role in preserving the environment.

Event Highlights:

Group Discussion on Environmental Issues:

1. The day began with an engaging **Group Discussion** on pressing **environmental issues**, moderated by faculty members from the **Political Science Department**. The discussion covered a wide range of topics, including:

 2. **Deforestation and Loss of Biodiversity**
